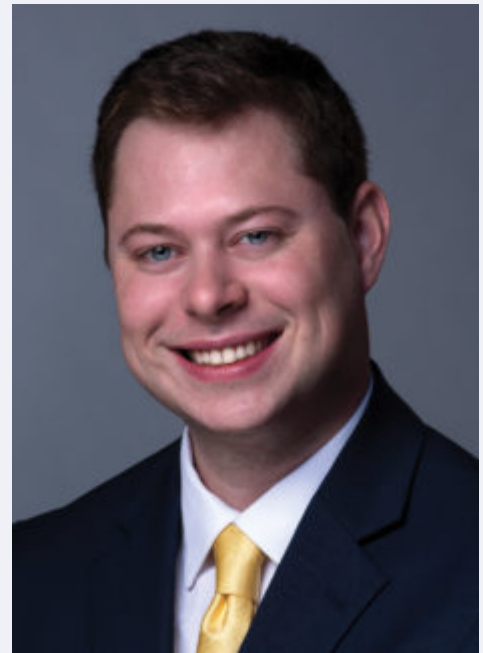
### Associate
